

# 2019 Member Survey Results

**Process:** The Ohio Overdose Prevention Network (Ohio OPN) conducts an annual member survey. Questions cover membership, participation, and infrastructure. The 2019 survey was emailed to 154 Ohio OPN members on 6/5/, 6/12, 6/19, and 6/24. 75 members completed the survey. The Ohio OPN Leadership Team compiled the survey results to determine coalition strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities for improvement.

Several questions asked members about recruitment, and these responses were used to create the coalition's Member Guide.

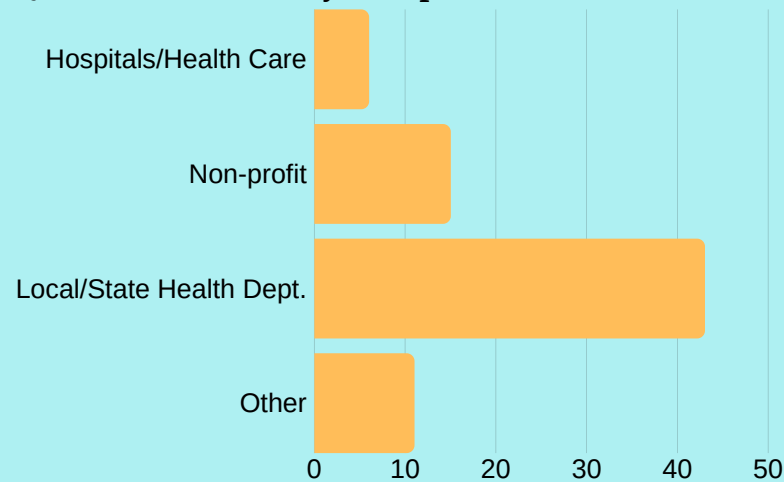

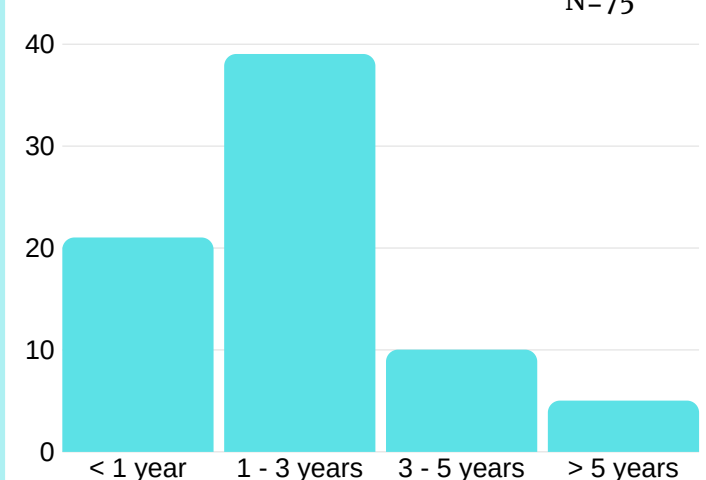

#### Q1. Which sector do you represent? N=75

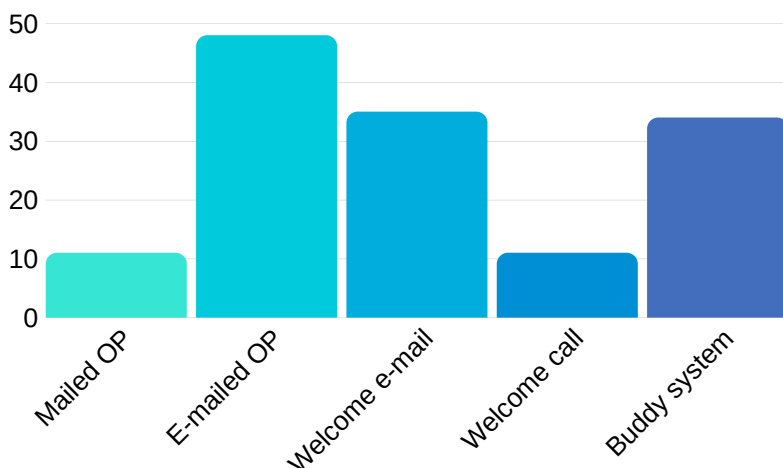


#### Q2. How long have you been involved in the Ohio OPN? N=75



#### Q5. How could the Ohio OPN best orient new members?

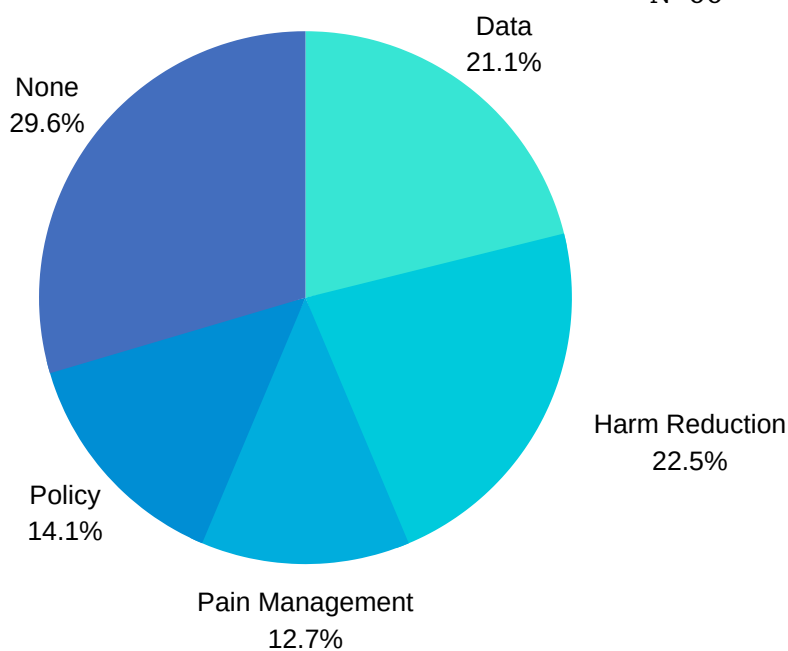

### Membership Demographics:

- Survey results identified a need for more representation in Ohio OPN from: people in recovery, pharmacists, faith-based organizations, harm reduction agencies, first responders, health care professionals, treatment providers and academic organizations.
- Member feedback on recruitment informed the policies and processes in the Ohio OPN Member guide.

## Member Participation

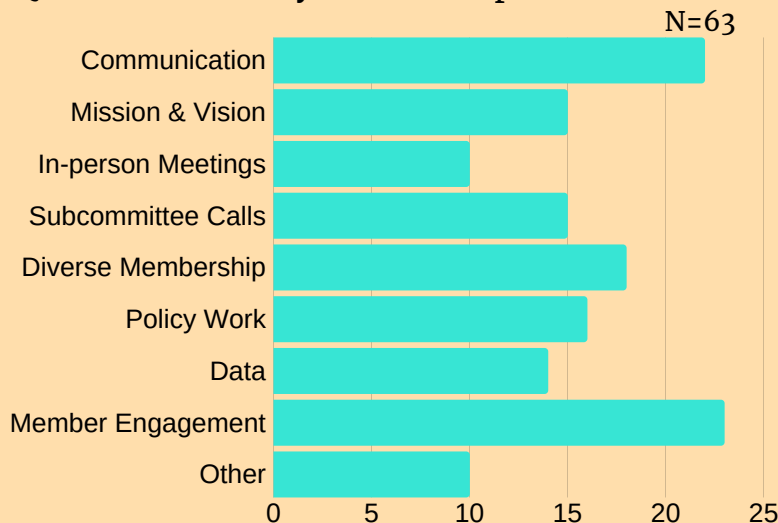
- 58% of members regularly attended meetings and 44% regularly attended committee conference calls.
- The leadership team identified subcommittee participation as a key area of improvement. The OIPP Membership Application was updated to include subcommittee options for the Ohio OPN.
- Members would like more time for subcommittee work at quarterly meetings.
- Regularly scheduled day and call times were suggested to improve committee conference calls.

## Infrastructure

- Member engagement and communication were the two areas most members identified as needing improvement. The Ohio OPN Chair will collaborate with subcommittee chairs and co-chairs to develop a plan for improvement.
- Members voted on new mission and vision statements.
- Members voted on a new coalition name.
