



Criteria for Referral for CANCER GENETICS Evaluation

If any of the following apply, genetic counseling is appropriate. Genetic Counseling may also be appropriate for individuals that do not meet criteria but are concerned about their history. A referral for genetic counseling does not always lead to a recommendation for genetic testing.

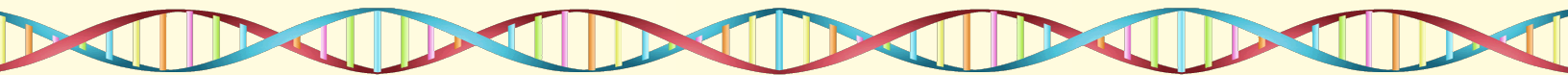
Personal History Includes:

- ☐ Adrenocortical carcinoma
- ☐ Choroid plexus carcinoma
- ☐ Breast cancer at age 50 or younger
- ☐ Breast cancer triple negative (receptor status negative for ER, PR, and HER2) at age 60 or younger
- ☐ Breast cancer in both breasts or multiple breast cancers
- ☐ Breast cancer, recurrent or metastatic HER2 negative
- ☐ Breast cancer, male
- ☐ Colorectal cancer at age 50 or younger
- ☐ Desmoid tumor
- ☐ Diffuse gastric cancer at age 40 or younger
- ☐ Hemangioblastoma
- ☐ Medullary thyroid cancer
- ☐ Ovarian, fallopian tube or primary peritoneal cancer
- ☐ Pancreatic cancer at age 49 or younger
- ☐ Prostate cancer, metastatic
- ☐ Renal cancer clear cell type at age 50 or younger
- ☐ Uterine cancer at age 49 or younger
- ☐ Multiple primary cancers: breast, ovarian, prostate, pancreatic, male breast, melanoma, uterine, thyroid, sarcoma, colorectal, small bowel, gastric, renal, etc.
- ☐ 10 or more colorectal polyps in a lifetime

Family History Includes:

- ☐ Adrenocortical carcinoma
- ☐ Ashkenazi Jewish ancestry and a personal or family history of breast, ovarian cancer, or pancreatic cancer
- ☐ Breast cancer, male
- ☐ Choroid plexus carcinoma
- ☐ Desmoid tumor
- ☐ Hemangioblastoma
- ☐ Ovarian, fallopian tube or primary peritoneal cancer
- ☐ Known Mutation

- ☐ **Two or more close relatives on the same side of the family with:**
 - ☐ Breast cancer
 - ☐ Uterine or colorectal cancers
 - ☐ Combination of these cancers:
Breast, ovarian, prostate, pancreatic, male breast, melanoma, uterine, thyroid, sarcoma, colorectal, small bowel, gastric, or renal.
